

March 31, 2022, OHSAA Appeals

The OHSAA Appeals Panel met with appellants on March 31, 2022, virtually through Microsoft Teams. Appeals Panel members were Mr. Tony Mantell, former superintendent of Portsmouth City Schools; Mr. Tyrone Olverson, former superintendent of Trotwood City Schools; Dr. Kathy McFarland, deputy chief executive director of the Ohio School Boards Association; and Dr. Keith Bell, former superintendent of the Euclid City Schools and Westerville City Schools. Mr. Mantell served as the appeals hearing officer.

A. Bylaw 4-4-1, Scholarship, A 12th-Grade Student, Strongsville High School (Northeast District)

A 12th-grade student at Strongsville High School did not pass five one-credits courses or the equivalent during the third grading period of the 2021-22 school year. The Executive Director's Office ruled that the student was ineligible for interscholastic athletics for the fourth grading period of the 2021-22 school year in accordance with Bylaw 4-4-1, Scholarship.

The student's parents, and Denny Ziegler, Strongsville athletic administrator appealed the ruling so that the student could be fully eligible to participate in interscholastic athletics at Strongsville High School.

There was a motion to **deny** the appeal.

Motion passed 4-0.
