Governor DeWine Announces Resources Available for School Athletic Coaches to Better Support Athletes

Ohio Governor Mike DeWine last week announced the availability of state training resources aimed at giving Ohio school athletics coaches the tools they need to help student-athletes struggling with their mental health. The recently passed biennial budget (House Bill 33) includes a provision that requires all coaches to complete the training before they can apply for or renew their pupil activity program permits. "Coaches know how to motivate young people and lead them to success on the field, but they may not be aware of how to help student-athletes with the challenges they may be facing off the field," Governor DeWine said. "The goal is to give coaches the tools they need to help identify student-athletes who may be struggling and connect them with the help they need."

The new law requires the Ohio Department of Education to work with the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services to provide options of approved trainings that help coaches satisfy requirements needed to obtain pupil activity permits, which are required for licensed educators and non-licensed school employees who direct, supervise or coach a student activity program that involves athletics, routine or regular physical activity, or activities with health and safety considerations. An individual must complete the training each time the individual applies for or renews a pupil activity program permit and present evidence of each successful completion to the State Board of Education.

Clarification on Schools Being Required to Accept Cash at School Affiliated Events

The OHSAA Executive Director's Office has been receiving a lot of questions about schools being required to accept cash at "school affiliated events" as an alternative to electronic ticketing. This requirement is NOT an OHSAA regulation but is a law that was passed by the Ohio legislature as part of the latest budget bill. This law officially goes into effect on October 4, but some schools have opted to adopt it at the start of the season while others have chosen to wait until the October date. The OHSAA does not regulate regular season contests except to: a.) place limits on the beginning and ending to each sport season; b.) place limits on the number of regular season and pre-season contests in which a team/individual may participate, and c.) adopt contest/playing rules for the sports. The OHSAA also does regulate interscholastic conferences or leagues.

As you are aware, the OHSAA and many schools have gone to electronic ticketing over the past few years for a number of reasons, including better accountability for auditors, less risk with collecting and depositing large amounts of cash and customer convenience. For this reason, many schools and the OHSAA are choosing to provide a discounted ticket price to those customers who elect to purchase online since there is nothing in the law that prevents organizations from incentivizing electronic ticketing over cash tickets. Schools Asked to Report Student Catastrophic Situations to OHSAA and NCCSIR

The OHSAA reminds school administrators of their reporting obligations when an unforeseen catastrophic situation occurs with a student-athlete at your school. First, please report the incident to OHSAA Senior Sport Administrator Emily Mason (emason@ohsaa.org), who oversees sports medicine/healthy lifestyles issues within the office. She will help ensure the proper OHSAA staff members involve the Association's catastrophic insurance carrier and will inform the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). School administrators are also asked to report their catastrophic situation with the National Center for

Catastrophic Sport Injury Research (NCCSIR) at www.sportinjuryreport.org. The NCCSIR, a research center that has tracked fatalities and catastrophic high school sports injuries in the United States since 1982, is directed by Kristen Kucera, Ph.D., at the University of North Carolina. Catastrophic athletic injuries, illnesses and medical conditions are defined as: 1.) Fatalities; 2.) Permanent disability injuries; 3.) Serious injuries (fractured spine/neck or serious head injury), even though the athlete has fully recovered; 4.) Temporary or transient paralysis (athlete has no movement for a short time but has a complete recovery); 5.) Heat stroke or exertional sickling due to exercise, and 6.) Sudden cardiac arrest or death in an athlete (even if not directly related to athletics).
