OHSAA will be hosting a free conference on "Addressing Key Issues in High School Sports" on Oct. 11, 2023, at the Quest Conference Center, 9200 Worthington Road, Westerville. Registration will start at 8:30 a.m., the conference begins at 9:00 and it will end at 3:00. The conference will open with a panel addressing issues in fan behavior, followed by sessions on recruiting more women and minorities into high school sports positions and officiating and a session with media members talking about working with the media as it relates to sporting behavior issues in high school sports. These sessions will repeat in the afternoon to allow all attendees to hear both sessions. In addition, attendees will hear about The Ohio State University LiFEsports program, an OHSAA partner program that assists coaches in several areas including recognizing mental health issues with their student-athletes. OHSAA Tournament Ticket Sales at School Venues

This is a reminder to administrators that OHSAA tournament tickets sales will be available online for all contests. For OHSAA tournament events held at school venues, cash will be accepted upon fan request on-site at the gate. Gate prices will be \$10 for sectional and district contests, \$15 for regional contests and \$20 for state events. Online tickets will be discounted 20 percent from gate ticket prices. Schools will utilize the HomeTown Ticketing (HTT) Gate App for selling and recording gate sales. Athletic administrators and school treasurers will reconcile cash collected to the audit report available in the HTT gate application. Predetermined Sites Being Utilized for 2023 Soccer Regional Contests

For the regional semifinal and final rounds of the 2023 OHSAA Soccer Tournament, predetermined sites have been selected based on this year's regional tournament draw conducted by the OHSAA Executive Director's Office. State semifinal sites have been predetermined based on location, with the primary concern of travel midweek for schools and the nature of the tournament bracket, bridging different regions in the state. These will not be made public until closer to the event. Many factors went into the consideration of sites including but not limited to location, ability to host, facility and venue size, officials' availability and field surface. Various constituents, including OHSAA District Athletic Board members and the Ohio Scholastic Soccer Coaches Association, were consulted in the recommendations and assignments of sites. Per the 2022 OHSAA Soccer Tournament Regulations, the OHSAA has the authority to change the date, time and site at any time for any reason. Changes will be considered in the event the change does not cause conflict for the stakeholders involved. Additionally, if a host previously indicated that they would not like to host due to their team advancing to regionals and beyond, back-up sites have already been predetermined. Start Date for Contests in 7th-8th Grade Boys Basketball is December 1

Just as it is at the high school level, administrators should note that the start date for contests in 7th-8th grade boys basketball is Friday, December 1. Two different start dates listed in the OHSAA Handbook and posted on the OHSAA website are incorrect. Please let your administrators and coaches at the 7th-8th grade level know of this date. National Athletic Equipment Reconditioners Association Provides Recommendations on Helmet Reconditioning/Recertification for Football, Lacrosse, Baseball and Softball

The National Athletic Equipment Reconditioners Association (NAERA), National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) and helmet manufacturers have provided the OHSAA with reconditioning and recertification recommendations for football, lacrosse, baseball and softball helmets, and those are being shared with the membership. NAERA recommends that during every football, lacrosse, baseball and softball season or practice period, every helmet in those sports be cleaned and inspected regularly by a school staff member with knowledge of manufacturer recommendations. It is further recommend that every helmet sbe reconditioned and recertified annually unless stated otherwise by the manufacturer. ONLY a company licensed by NOCSAE can perform the recertification of helmets in those four sports. For a list of NAERA members that are licensed by NOCSAE, go to: www.naera.net.. The Positive Coaching Alliance is accepting nominations from administrators through Nov. 15 for 2024 coaches-of-the-year. Nominees should teach life skills through sports; encourage athletes to focus on their effort and not be afraid of making mistakes; support athletes by focusing on positive reinforcement; promote behaving respectfully; create an environment of belonging with focus on equity and inclusion; work to advocate for access for all kids to play by helping to remove barriers such as cost and equipment, and display empathy and compassion in their approach to coaching.
