OHSAA Football Playoffs Details

The 2023 OHSAA football playoffs will feature many of the same elements as last year's tournament except that all rounds prior to the state finals will be held on Fridays. Each region will qualify 16 teams to the playoffs (448 total teams; 64 teams per division); regional first-round and regional quarterfinal games will be hosted by the higher seeds, and regional semifinals, regional finals and state semifinals contests will be held at neutral sites. The state finals will return to Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton Nov. 30 and Dec. 1 and 2. Here are football dates to remember for 2023:

Reminder: State Law Requires All Coaches to Have PAP and to be Board-Approved

With OHSAA fall tournaments either under way or soon to begin, administrators are reminded that state law REQUIRES individuals who direct, supervise or coach in your athletics program to have a valid **coaching or pupil activity permit**. That requirement is codified in OHSAA Bylaw 6-1-2 and applies to all coaches, whether paid or volunteer. In addition, OHSAA Bylaw 6-1-3 requires that all coaches be approved by the Board of Education or similar governing board in non-public schools. OHSAA Tournament Tickets for School Administrators

Complimentary tickets for school administrators to attend OHSAA tournament events will work the same in 2023-24 as last year. All member school athletic administrators received an email earlier this fall with their 'school comp code' and instructions. This comp code allows schools to redeem tickets through HomeTown Ticketing, the OHSAA's official digital ticketing partner, when their teams are competing (three for individual sports; eight for team sports). Again, this will be the ability for school administrators (superintendents, principals and athletic administrators) to REQUEST complimentary tickets to OHSAA tournament events not involving your school at the sectional and district levels of OHSAA tournaments. This request needs to include the date, time and sport and should come from your official school email address. The request needs to be emailed to claired@ohsaa.org a minimum of 24 hours before the event. OHSAA Tournament Ticket Sales at School Venues

This is a reminder to administrators that OHSAA tournament tickets sales will be available online for all contests. For OHSAA tournament events held at school venues, cash will be accepted upon fan request on-site at the gate. Gate prices will be \$10 for sectional and district contests, \$15 for regional contests and \$20 for state events. Online tickets will be discounted 20 percent from gate ticket prices. Schools will utilize the HomeTown Ticketing (HTT) Gate App for selling and recording gate sales. Athletic administrators and school treasurers will reconcile cash collected to the audit report available in the HTT gate application. It's Not Too Late to Register for OHSAA Basketball Foundation Games

Member school administrators are reminded that an approved OHSAA Foundation Game is permitted in the sport of basketball. Foundation Games may be played anytime from the team's last pre-season scrimmage until the first sectional tournament game. Member schools may elect to participate by substituting a Foundation Game for one of the five allotted scrimmages. This game can be played as an "exhibition" game, utilizing all normal playing rules, but the win/loss does not count toward the team's record. Another option is to dedicate a regular season contest as a Foundation Game (which WOULD count as one of your school's 22-allotted contests), and the win/loss does count toward the team's record. The National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) has provided a list of several websites that are available for students who are struggling with mental health issues. The websites are:

• Mental Health is Health (www.mentalhealthishealth.us)

This interactive website is based on the concept of caring for mental health just like physical health. The initiative aims to normalize mental health conversation, connect individuals with resources and inspire action on mental health advocacy.

• Youth.gov (https://youth.gov/youth-topics/youth-mental-health)

This site offers comprehensive advice, data, resources, examples and model programs on creating and investing in school-based mental health services.

• TeenHelp (www.teenhelp.com)

This site was developed for parents of teens and offers fact sheets, statistics and information on topics such as self-esteem, suicide, depression, sexual abuse/trauma and substance abuse.

• Crisis Text Line (www.crisistextline.org)

This 24-hour support for individuals in crisis allows individuals to text 741741 from anywhere in the United States and receive an automated text asking what the crisis is. Within minutes, a crisis counselor will respond, and the exchange is free, confidential and does not appear on a phone statement.

Predetermined Sites Being Utilized for 2023 Soccer Regional Contests

For the regional semifinal and final rounds of the 2023 OHSAA Soccer Tournament, predetermined sites have been selected based on this year's regional tournament draw conducted by the OHSAA Executive Director's Office. State semifinal sites have been predetermined based on location, with the primary concern of travel midweek for schools and the nature of the tournament bracket, bridging different regions in the state. These will not be made public until closer to the event. Many factors went into the consideration of sites including but not limited to location, ability to host, facility and venue size, officials' availability and field surface. Various constituents, including OHSAA District Athletic Board members and the Ohio Scholastic Soccer Coaches Association, were consulted in the recommendations and assignments of sites. Per the 2022 OHSAA Soccer Tournament Regulations, the OHSAA has the authority to change the date, time and site at any time for any reason. Changes will be considered in the event the change does not cause conflict for the stakeholders involved. Additionally, if a host previously indicated that they would not like to host due to their team advancing to regionals and beyond, back-up sites have already been predetermined. Start Date for Contests in 7th-8th Grade Boys Basketball is December 1

Just as it is at the high school level, administrators should note that the start date for contests in 7th-8th grade boys basketball is Friday, Dec. 1.
