NEW! New State Law Requiring AEDs Now In Effect

The new state law which requires Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) to be placed in each public and chartered nonpublic school and each municipal sports and recreation location, except in townships and villages with populations of less than 5,000, became effective last week. As part of the law, the Ohio Department of Health (ODH) has developed a Model AED Emergency Action Plan for the Use of the AED for those required to follow the new regulation. Athletic Administrators should have recently received an email with the latest OHSAA Quarterly Technology Update. An item worth noting is the update on tournament officials voting and ratings. That information follows:

During the week of October 7, DragonFly completed the functionality for Tournament Officials Voting by Athletic Administrator within the platform. Over the next several weeks, the OHSAA officiating department will be providing instructions on how to access and complete this requirement. Please keep an eye on your email for more information. Additionally, DragonFly will begin the work on Officials Ratings by Coaches soon. This will involve FinalForms and DragonFly working together. The plan is to utilize the coach information within FinalForms and "push" it into DragonFly through an API, creating those accounts for coaches in DragonFly. This is part of our goal to limit the number of locations in which information needs to be entered and the number of accounts that need to be created. We will keep you updated on any features that become available to work through this functionality.

NEW! National Athletic Equipment Reconditioners Association Provides Recommendations on Helmet Reconditioning/Recertification for Football, Lacrosse, Baseball and Softball

The National Athletic Equipment Reconditioners Association (NAERA), National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) and helmet manufacturers have provided the OHSAA with reconditioning and recertification recommendations for football, lacrosse, baseball and softball helmets, and those are being shared with the membership. NAERA recommends that during every football, lacrosse, baseball and softball season or practice period, every helmet in those sports be cleaned and inspected regularly by a school staff member with knowledge of manufacturer recommendations. It is further recommended that every helmet be reconditioned and recertified annually unless stated otherwise by the manufacturer. ONLY a company licensed by NOCSAE can perform the recertification of helmets in those four sports. For a list of NAERA members that are licensed by NOCSAE, go to: www.naera.net. OHSAA State Football Finals Tickets on Sale

All-session and indoor Stadium Club tickets, single-day packages and a team one-day discount package are currently on sale for the 2024 OHSAA State Football Finals that will be held Dec. 5-7 at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton. Stadium Club all-session tickets include free access to tour the Pro Football Hall of Fame during the state championship weekend. The Pro Football Hall of Fame and Hall of Fame Village are located adjacent to the stadium. Tickets for the state football finals, and all OHSAA postseason tournament contests in all sports, are available at www.OHSAA.org/tickets. Single-game ticket sales for the football state finals begin November 29.

ALL-SESSION STADIUM CLUB: All-session Stadium Club tickets are \$150 each and provide one ticket to all seven games in a theater style seat as well as access to the indoor club level of the press box containing its own concessions. Patrons with club access do not need to exit the stadium between games. The all-session Stadium Club package also includes access to tour the Pro Football Hall of Fame during the OHSAA Football State Championship weekend. A limited number of all-session Stadium Club tickets that include a parking pass are also available for \$210 each. These ticket holders will receive a parking hangtag for the weekend valid for a lot near the stadium.

ALL-SESSION GENERAL ADMISSION OR SINGLE-DAY PACKAGES: Other options include all-session general admission tickets that are \$90 for adults and \$60 for students, or three-game, single-day packages for Friday or Saturday games only that cost \$75 for Club Seating or \$40 for adults or \$30 for students for general admission seating.

TEAM ONE-DAY DISCOUNT PACKAGE: Additionally, a one-day discount package is available for football teams from elementary through high school. Teams can choose to attend the single game on Thursday, all three games on Friday or all three games on Saturday. There is a maximum of four adults who can purchase tickets for every 12 youth tickets purchased (e.g. a minimum of 12 youth tickets must be purchased per order, although there is no maximum number of youth tickets that can be purchased). The breakdown is as follows (**Note:** Purchasers will be directed to a Google page to complete information. A promo code will then be generated to complete the purchase):

OHSAA Football Playoffs Details

The 2024 OHSAA football playoffs will begin soon and feature many of the same elements as last year's tournament. Each region will qualify 16 teams to the playoffs (448 total teams; 64 teams per division); regional first-round and regional quarterfinal games will be hosted by the higher seeds, and regional semifinals, regional finals and state semifinals contests will be held at neutral sites. Like last year, all tournament contests prior to the state finals will be held on Fridays. The state finals will return to Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton Dec. 5-7. Reminder: State Law Requires All Coaches to Have PAP and to be Board-Approved

With OHSAA fall tournaments under way, administrators are reminded that state law REQUIRES individuals who direct, supervise or coach in your athletics program to have a valid **coaching or pupil activity permit**. That requirement is codified in OHSAA Bylaw 6-1-2 and applies to all coaches, whether paid or volunteer. School districts determine which staff members need to have a permit. In addition, OHSAA Bylaw 6-1-3 requires that all coaches be approved by the Board of Education or similar governing board in non-public schools.

About Coach Beyond: In 2021, the OHSAA and LiFEsports at The Ohio State University started collaborative work to change the landscape of coach training and education in Ohio. Ultimately, this partnership grew into a statewide initiative known as Coach Beyond. Over the last three years, a team of coaches, athletic administrators, OHSAA administrators and LiFEsports leaders set out to audit coaching education, conduct a statewide needs assessment, design and pilot trainings and ultimately train 15,000 coaches by June 2024. This goal has been reached, with 20,000-plus coaches receiving this training.
