OHSAA Tournament Tickets for School Administrators

Complimentary tickets for school administrators to attend OHSAA tournament events will work the same in 2025-26 as last year. All member school athletic administrators received an email in mid-September with their school comp code and instructions. This comp code allows schools to redeem tickets through Hometown, the OHSAA's official digital ticketing partner, when your teams are competing in OHSAA tournaments (three for individual sports; eight for team sports). The code you received is different from last year's code, but this code can be used throughout the 2025-26 school year.

Superintendents and principals who desire to attend a sectional or district tournament contest that does NOT involve your school can request a maximum of two complimentary tickets. This request needs to include the date, time and sport and should come from your official school email address. School Dues Invoices to be Sent Soon

Invoices will be sent to OHSAA member schools soon regarding your dues for the 2025-26 school year. No changes were made in the amount for this school year, with the approved fee continuing to be \$50 per OHSAA recognized sport. Schools that fail to pay these dues will not be eligible receive their annual athletic enrichment fund donation check next year. That amount for the 2024-25 school year was \$1,250 per school.

• October is National High School Activities Month

Besides Officials Appreciation Week that begins October 5, the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) has launched the 45th annual celebration of National High School Activities Month this week, and the need for leaders throughout the nation to understand the importance and value of high school sports and activities has never been stronger.

In fact, the NFHS has embarked on a special campaign this year designed to "Protect the Purpose" of these programs and the almost 20,000 high schools and 51 member state associations that provide participation opportunities for millions of high school students. The goal is to protect the last bastion of amateur sports in our country. The landscape is changing around us, so the benefits and values of education-based activity programs must be proclaimed louder than ever.

In a recent online article published on a Rhode Island website, Mike Lunney, executive director of the Rhode Island Interscholastic League (RIIL), addressed the situation as follows: "We're sandwiched," he said. "Everything below us is kind of geared toward winning and specialization. Everything above us is about money, even at the college level. We're kind of that last group trying to provide opportunities for kids to be connected to the school. That's our main goal."

Ohio schools are highly encouraged to take place in National High School Activities Month and share to everyone in your school community why high school sports are so essential in our nation's schools. The special weeks are as follows:

- September 28-October 4: National High School Colors Week. Our school colors, mascot and song are things we proudly carry with us throughout our lives, and this week is a special time to celebrate those once-in-a-lifetime experiences. Specifically, Friday, October 3, is National High School Colors Day, a perfect time to wear those school colors and end the week by packing the bleachers at the Friday night football game.
- October 5-11: NFHS #OfficialsAppreciationWeek A special week to celebrate the hundreds of thousands of individuals who give time to serve as high school contest officials.
- October 12-18: NFHS #MadePossibleWeek This week is designed for schools and state associations to celebrate coaches, athletic administrators, sponsors and others who devote their lives to students through activity programs.
- October 19-25: NFHS #BeyondTheBellWeek This special week promotes those individuals involved in performing arts and
 middle school activity programs, and the importance of community service programs.
- October 26-31: NFHS #NextStepPrepWeek This week is designed to offer tips on preparing for life after high school, including involvement from the NFHS National Student Advisory Committee.

Ohio Department of Health Modifies AED Model Emergency Action Plan

The Ohio Department of Health (ODH) has modified the Model Emergency Action Plan for the Use of the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) by public and chartered nonpublic schools, youth sports organizations, and municipal sports and recreation locations.

You may recall that ODH released the original model emergency action plan in October 2024 in accordance with House Bill 47 (https://www.legislature.ohio.gov/legislation/135/hb47) passed by the 135th Ohio General Assembly. Under the law, AEDs must be placed in each public and chartered nonpublic school, and in each municipal sports and recreation location, except in townships and villages with populations of less than 5,000.

New language is highlighted in **BLUE TEXT** in the following excerpt:

Protocol:

If a person:

- Is unresponsive and does not respond to shouting or tapping, OR
- Collapses suddenly and loses consciousness (passes out), OR
- Is not breathing, has abnormal breathing, is gasping for air, or has seizure like activity, OR
- Does not have a pulse.

Note: A person's eyes may be open or closed.

2. If person is unresponsive and does not respond to shouting or tapping OR collapses suddenly and loses consciousness (passes out), OR is not breathing, has abnormal breathing, is gasping for air, or has seizure like activity, OR does not have a pulse shout for help, CALL EMS (9-1-1), and send someone to get the AED. Stay on the line with EMS (preferably on speaker phone) for instructions on CPR and AED use.

About Coach Beyond: In 2021, the OHSAA and LiFEsports at The Ohio State University started collaborative work to change the landscape of coach training and education in Ohio. Ultimately, this partnership grew into a statewide initiative known as Coach Beyond. Over the last four years, a team of coaches, athletic administrators, OHSAA administrators and LiFEsports leaders set out to audit coaching education, conduct a statewide needs assessment, design and pilot trainings and ultimately train 15,000 coaches by June 2024.
