• OHSAA Offers Webinars on NIL to Provide Information, Answer Questions on Upcoming Referendum Vote

As you are aware, a temporary restraining order has been issued by the judge overseeing the ongoing lawsuit filed against the OHSAA regarding Name, Image, and Likeness (NIL). This order currently prevents the OHSAA from enforcing any NIL rules, leaving our schools and student-athletes without clear guardrails. To help you make an informed decision on the upcoming emergency vote between November 17 and 21 on the proposed NIL language, the OHSAA has announced an exclusive partnership with Influential Athlete, LLC, to educate and support our member schools on the proposed language that would allow high school athletes in Ohio to participate in NIL opportunities under a structured, education-first framework.

It is highly recommended that school administrators attend one of the two educational webinars below. These sessions will clarify what the proposed language means so you can cast your vote with full confidence.

Influential Athlete, the nation's leading NIL education and consulting company, brings a proven national track record in helping athletic associations, schools and programs navigate the NIL landscape responsibly and effectively. The company recently partnered with the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA) following a failed NIL vote in that state. After months of comprehensive education and administrative support led by Influential Athlete, Wisconsin's NIL proposal was brought back to vote and passed nearly 3 to 1 statewide in April 2025.

OHSAA Football Playoffs Details

The 2025 OHSAA football playoffs will begin Friday, and and this year's tournament features some new elements. Each region has qualified 12 teams to the playoffs (336 total teams; 48 teams per division); regional first-round, regional quarterfinal and regional semifinal games will be hosted by the higher seeds, and regional finals and state semifinals contests will be held at neutral sites. Like last year, all tournament contests prior to the state finals will be held on Fridays. The state finals will return to Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton Dec. 4-6. Here are football dates to remember for 2025:

- Oct. 31 First-Round Playoff Games Higher Seeded Team Hosts (top 4 seeds in each region receive a bye; Seed 5 vs. 12; Seed 6 vs. 11; Seed 7 vs. 10; Seed 8 vs. 9)
- Nov. 7 Regional Quarterfinals Top Four Seeds Host (Seed 1 vs. winner of 8/9; Seed 4 vs. winner of 5/12; Seed 2 vs. winner of 7/10; Seed 3 vs. winner of 6/11).
- Nov. 14 Regional Semifinals Higher Seeds Host
- Nov. 21 Regional Finals at Neutral Sites
- Nov. 28 State Semifinals at Neutral Sites
- Dec. 4-6 State Championships in Canton at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium (Thursday, Dec. 4, Div. II 7:00; Friday, Dec. 5, Div. IV 10:30; Div. II 3:00; Div. I 7:30; Saturday, Dec. 6, Div. VII 10:30; Div. VI 3:00; Div. V 7:30)

• OHSAA State Football Finals Ticket Sales Have Begun

All-session and indoor Stadium Club tickets, single-day packages and a team one-day discount package have started for the 2025 OHSAA State Football Finals that will be held Dec. 4-6 at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium in Canton. Stadium Club all-session tickets include free access to tour the Pro Football Hall of Fame during the state championship weekend. The Pro Football Hall of Fame and Hall of Fame Village are located adjacent to the stadium. Tickets for the state football finals, and all OHSAA postseason tournament contests in all sports, are available at: www.OHSAA.org/tickets.

Single-game tickets for the football state finals will be on sale in late November.

ALL-SESSION STADIUM CLUB: All-session Stadium Club tickets are \$155 each and provide one ticket to all seven games in a theater style seat as well as access to the indoor club level of the press box containing its own concessions. Patrons with club access do not need to exit the stadium between games. The all-session Stadium Club package also includes access to tour the Pro Football Hall of Fame during the OHSAA Football State Championship weekend. A limited number of all-session Stadium Club tickets that include a parking pass are also available for \$215 each. These ticket holders will receive a parking hangtag for the weekend valid for a lot near the stadium.

ALL-SESSION GENERAL ADMISSION OR SINGLE-DAY PACKAGES: Other options include all-session general admission tickets that are \$95 for adults and \$60 for students, or three-game, single-day packages for Friday or Saturday games only that cost \$77 for Club Seating or \$42 for adults or \$30 for students for general admission seating.

TEAM ONE-DAY DISCOUNT PACKAGE: Additionally, a one-day discount package is available for football teams from elementary through high school. Teams can choose to attend the single game on Thursday, all three games on Friday or all three games on Saturday. There is a maximum of four adults who can purchase tickets for every 12 youth tickets purchased (e.g. a minimum of 12 youth tickets must be purchased per order, although there is no maximum number of youth tickets that can be purchased). The breakdown is as follows (**Note:** Purchasers will be directed to a Google Form to complete information. A promo code will then be generated to complete the purchase): **Youth Tickets:** \$6* **Adult Tickets:** \$12* * Indicates the option of a \$10 per person add-on for a discounted Pro Football Hall of Fame tour pass.

Ultimately, this partnership grew into a statewide initiative known as Coach Beyond. Over the last four years, a team of coaches, athletic administrators, OHSAA administrators and LiFEsports leaders set out to audit coaching education, conduct a statewide needs assessment, design and pilot trainings and ultimately train 15,000 coaches by June 2024.
