• Let's Make Sporting Behavior a Priority

With the winter seasons upon us, administrators are reminded that making sporting behavior a priority during our contests and events must be a priority. This especially holds true in the sport of basketball, where high fan interest and large crowds are the norm at many schools. Please remind your coaches, participants, student groups and parents that they represent the entire school community, and any unsporting actions are a poor reflection on everyone and defeat the purpose of interscholastic athletics, which are educational in nature.

Administrators with teams involved in all-day events or multi-contests on a single day are also asked to remind your coaches that their student-athletes need to demonstrate sporting behavior before, in-between and after their events/contests.

An effective tool to assist with this effort is to consider having your students address their peers on positive sporting behavior by reading a live pregame statement. Sporting behavior scripts for one or two students to read live prior to a home game are available here:

OHSAA Scholarship Program Information Coming Soon

Athletic administrators will be receiving information next month (and principals will be copied) on the process to begin nominating qualified senior student-athletes for an OHSAA Scholar-Athlete Scholarship. Each school may submit only one male, one female, one male ethnic minority and one female ethnic minority candidate for scholarship consideration. Recipients of any athletic scholarships (full or partial) in NCAA Division I or II institutions or appointees to military academies are not eligible. The on-line application process will include information being entered by a school administrator (principal or athletic administrator), the student and a school guidance counselor. To ensure that emails do not get trapped by firewalls/sent to a spam folder, this year's process will again include the school administrator emailing student candidates directly with the application information.

Note that the Board approved modifications to OHSAA spring sports tournament regulations (which will be posted on the OHSAA website in the near future) along with the start date for regular season contests in the sport of field hockey moving to Monday, August 17, in 2026 and Monday, August 16, in 2027.

• Athletic Administrators: Remind Coaches to Update Basketball Scores in MaxPreps App

With the MaxPreps Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) being used again this year for seeding for all girls and boys basketball tournaments, athletic administrators are asked to remind their basketball coaches to report scores in their MaxPreps account within 24 hours after each contest. As reminders: 1.) Make sure your school's varsity schedules are updated and accurate. If you have any missing games, please add them. 2.) After your game, open the MaxPreps Admin app and update your score in your account. 3.) The WINNING TEAM is responsible for reporting scores into MaxPreps. Only one team needs to report the score. If playing at a neutral site or playing out-of-state, which will happen frequently during Martin Luther King Jr. and President's Day weekends, be sure to input your score. It is highly recommended that each school check the results to ensure accuracy.

The RPI rankings may only be accessed on the OHSAA website. Once the rankings are live, they will be updated daily. The final day for score submissions will be prior to the OHSAA Basketball Tournament Draw meetings, with the exact date and time to be announced. Have a Team Traveling Out-of-State? Don't Forget . . .

Administrators are reminded that schools may travel out of state to compete in contests in states or provinces in Canada that are contiguous to Ohio regardless of distance to travel. The states include Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Pennsylvania and West Virginia. The province includes Ontario. Additionally, schools may travel out of state one time per interscholastic season to compete in contests and/or practices in any location that does not border Ohio subject to approval of the OHSAA Executive Director's Office. If such approval is given, it is the sole discretion of the school as to whether the team/individual is permitted to miss school time. The penalty for traveling to a non-bordering location to compete in contests on more than one occasion shall be ineligibility for the OHSAA postseason tournament in the sport in which the out-of-state travel was involved. Further, the offending school could be subject to additional penalties as referenced in Bylaw 11. A school which travels to a non-bordering location without approval from the Executive Director's Office shall be subject to a fine and could be subject to additional penalties as referenced in Bylaw 11. Streetsboro Athletic Administrator Randy Tevepaugh Wins National Citation

Randy Tevepaugh, athletic administrator at Streetsboro High School, was one of eight athletic administrators across the country who was recently awarded a citation from the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS). NFHS Citations are presented annually to outstanding athletic administrators in recognition of contributions to interscholastic athletics at the local, state and national levels. Tevepaugh was presented his award during the 56th annual National Athletic Directors Conference Dec. 14 in Tampa. The conference is sponsored by both the NFHS and the National Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (NIAAA).

Tevepaugh is in his second year of a three-year term on the OHSAA Board of Directors and has been a member of the Northeast District Athletic Board since 2012. He also is on the Ohio Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association (OIAAA) Executive Board and is the Quality Program Assessment Committee chair for the NIAAA, while also serving as a mentor and cohort facilitator. Tevepaugh, who is dedicated to advancing student-athlete experiences and community engagement, has won numerous awards for his work at the local, state and national levels.

About Coach Beyond: In 2021, the OHSAA and LiFEsports at The Ohio State University started collaborative work to change the landscape of coach training and education in Ohio. Ultimately, this partnership grew into a statewide initiative known as Coach Beyond. Over the last four years, a team of coaches, athletic administrators, OHSAA administrators and LiFEsports leaders set out to audit coaching education, conduct a statewide needs assessment, design and pilot trainings and ultimately train 15,000 coaches by June 2024. We are excited to share that our training of coaches to go beyond the X's and O's has exceeded that goal and was have reached over 52,000 coaches in Ohio!
