# A. General Sport Regulation 6, Tournament Entry/Withdraw Procedures, Mogadore Junior High School (Northeast District)

On April 13, 2021, the OHSAA Office denied Mogadore Junior High School's late entry petition for the OHSAA 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade State Track & Field Meet, per OHSAA General Sport Regulation 6.

Mogadore Junior High School athletic administrator Stephen Lutz appealed the ruling so that the school would be granted entry into the OHSAA 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade State Track & Field Meet.

# B. General Sport Regulation 6, Tournament Entry/Withdraw Procedures, Mayfield Middle School (Northeast District)

On May 3, 2021, the OHSAA Office denied Mayfield Middle School's late entry petition for the OHSAA 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade State Track & Field Meet, per OHSAA General Sport Regulation 6.

Mayfield Middle School athletic administrator Tina Leonard appealed the ruling so that the school would be granted entry into the OHSAA 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> Grade State Track & Field Meet.
