Greetings OPSWA members and thanks for your coverage of high school sports. Congratulations to the OPSWA – membership has now reached 201 members! In addition to several updates below (including updated member list), this memo serves as the process members will use to elect OPSWA officers for two-year terms beginning May 1.

OPSWA Officer Elections

From the list of potential officers below, please reply to this memo by 5 p.m. on April 20 with the names of up to four individuals who you would like to see be an OPSWA officer for a two-year term (May 2022 through May 2024). It does not matter what order you list the names, as the highest vote getter will be president, while the next three highest vote getters will be vice presidents. OPSWA officers select the Hall of Fame, vote for All-Ohio teams (with the district chairmen), determine any changes to OPSWA procedures, etc. I will file all ballots (print reply emails), mark the membership list when a member has voted, and then utilize OHSAA staff and a couple non-candidate OPSWA members to help tabulate the votes on April 21.

I appreciate all seven of these individuals being willing to serve as an officer, and I anticipate that all seven will remain involved in OPSWA matters and all-district teams even if they are not one of the four officers.
