Re: Spring Sport Season Cancelled

This is a very strange time in our history, and we are emotional about the fact that our students will not be able to participate in spring sports. Also, it is disheartening that our schools cannot garner any revenue from spring sports as well as officials cannot recoup some of their expenses through spring sport activities. As you know, officiating OHSAA interscholastic contests requires certification. Most non-school leagues, whether in the summer or fall, also require OHSAA certification. The OHSAA provides the vehicle for the certification. We do not provide the regular season contests.

With that said we should talk about what the certification actually provides. The dues paid for certification are for the services that the OHSAA provides to officials. Some of those services include the insurance (which is also valid during non-OHSAA events), as well as the pre-season materials and any personal services by the OHSAA officiating staff. Some of those personal services include creating online meetings and processing upgrades, reinstatements, and educational credits. The dues also go to support things like the Directors of Officiating Development (DODs) and our District Administrators. All of these services have been and are currently being delivered.

We do not currently plan to issue any refunds or credit any dues toward next season. We have discussed what we will be instituting for the 2020-2021 school and fiscal year. We will be discussing in the coming weeks renewal periods, including the late renewal period. We have to assess information as it develops as to what the fall season could look like. We will update you as information becomes available.
