The promotion from Class 2 to Class 1 does not become effective until the following year provided the official renews their officiating permit.

Neither the observing official nor the Association are permitted to charge the applicant any fee for their observing service. Observations **may** be conducted by a Class 1 official working in the same athletic contest as the applicant official.
