Virtual Local Meeting

The Cross Country online local meeting is now live on DragonFly! It will be available until Monday, September 30, at 11:59 p.m. Watching this video will grant you one of your cross country local meeting requirements for the 2024-2025 athletic year. Credit will not be uploaded until after the meeting is closed.

2024 Cross Country Tournament Regulations & Information

The 2024 Cross Country Tournament Regulations were approved in late August, and a copy can be found at the link below. They include several new regulations intended to bring consistency across all of our sites and provide our student-athletes with predictable and consistent competition. In order to help you better prepare for the tournament competition, you will find a summary of changes below; please refer to the links to review all of the changes. You will receive additional tournament information in early October.

Substitution Policy: Coaches will be able to make substitutions via an online form found on the meet's MileSplit page through Friday at noon. If a substitution is needed after that, paper forms will be provided by meet management, and those can be turned in on the day of the meet to the timing team. The deadline for changes is 30 minutes prior to the race.

Bib Replacement Fee: At all three levels of tournaments, the replacement of a lost or damaged bib will require signing a bib replacement form and a \$20 fee. The fee will be invoiced to the school following the meet. The goal of this new fee is to encourage the safe handling of bibs and reduce the number that have to be replaced on the day of the event.

Verification Forms: For all meets being hosted on MileSplit, coaches' verification forms will be completed during the registration process. No paper forms will be needed for any meeting hosted on MileSplit, including the OHSAA tournaments.

Starting Line: Several additions/clarifications have been made to the starting lines.

- Curved Starting Line: All starting lines must be constructed in a way to ensure all boxes are equidistance from the first significant change. This means that some courses will need a curved starting line. Details can be found in the managers' manual.
- 3M Step Back Line: All starting lines must include a 3M step back line where all athletes will line up before stepping to the starting line on the long whistle blast.
- Starting Boxes: All starting boxes must be precisely 6 feet wide and numbered with the box on the left (when facing the course) as box one and the box on the right being the highest number. Box assignments must be random and centered on the starting line.
- Individual Qualifiers: Individual qualifiers should be assigned to boxes in groups of four to ensure they can all "toe the line"; there will be times more or less will be assigned to a box based on the total



number of individual qualifiers. Every effort will be made to assign individual qualifiers from the same school to the same or adjacent boxes.

Live Results: In order to provide consistency for coaches, all live results at the Regional & State Meets must be done through MileSplit Live.

Team Passes: The number of team passes has been increased from 10 to 11; please see the chart below.

Unauthorized Course Access: Additional penalties now apply for team members (as defined by the NFHS) who access areas they are not authorized to be in.

- First Offense: Warning issued to the **TEAM**.
 - The official will report the warning to the referee, documenting the time. The referee will then attempt to notify the head coach. The warning stands regardless of if the coach is officially notified.
- Second Offense: Disqualification from the meet (ejection) for those accessing the competition area.
 - As the warning applies to the team, any member of that team is subject to disqualification from the meet.
- <u>Third Offense:</u> Disqualification from the meet (ejection) for those accessing the competition area & disqualification from the event for any participating athletes.

These penalties DO NOT change the enforcement of NFHS Regulations related to coaching from a restricted area. The penalty for that is a disqualification of all team members from the event.

Wheeled Transportation For Coaches: To ensure the safety of all athletes and spectators, the use of wheeled transportation (bicycles, scooters, etc.) at the tournaments is prohibited. The use of these items is considered an illegal aid, and the penalty is the disqualification of all team members from the event.

The OTFCCOA Annual Winter Clinic will be held on January 24 & 25, 2025 at the Nationwide Hotel & Conference Center in Lewis Center, Ohio. Officials will have the opportunity to earn TWO local meeting credits, one for each day of the clinic, as well as their state rules interpretation credit. More information will be sent to all officials in the fall by the OHSAA on behalf of the OTFCCOA.
