OHSAA TOURNAMENT DIVISIONS: PAST BOARD ACTION

- June 2006: Board approved recommendation that in football, Division I will be top 10 percent of schools, with the other five divisions divided evenly. In sports with four divisions (volleyball, basketball, baseball, softball), Division I will be top 22 percent with other three divisions comprised of 26 percent. In sports with three divisions, Division I will be top 28 percent with other two divisions comprised of 36 percent. In sports with two divisions, Division I will be top 45 percent; Division II the remaining 55 percent. Schools will also have the option of moving up to Division I on a sport-by-sport basis (minimum of two years).
- January 2007: Board *rescinded* June 2006 proposal.
- April 2012: Board *approved* recommendation to expand **football** to seven divisions. Division I will be top 10 percent of schools, with the other six divisions divided evenly.
- October 2019: Board tabled recommendation from OHSAA Four-Division Committee to address the enrollment disparity for schools from the top to the bottom of Division I in the four-division team sports that would limit the number of schools placed in Division I. The breakdown Volleyball: 129/218/216/221; Boys Basketball: 128/220/223/221; Girls Basketball: 130/219/219/219; Baseball: 128/216/216; Softball: 128/207/207/207.

OHSAA TOURNAMENT DIVISIONS: RECENT DISCUSSIONS

- Executive Director Ute: On-going concerns from administrators and coaches have been raised since his hiring in September 2020 regarding the number of OHSAA tournament divisions and especially about the disparity in enrollment for schools from the top to the bottom of Division I. State basketball coaches association submitted proposal on expanded divisions.
- September 12, 2022: Meeting was held at the OHSAA Office with staff members, school administrators and executives from other state educational service organizations to discuss potential changes in OHSAA tournament divisions. Current Board of Directors and District Athletic Board members were included. Feedback was positive that something should be done.
- December 16, 2022: OHSAA staff members met with Southwest Ohio athletic administrators from schools at the lower end of Division I to discuss the disparity in enrollment for schools from the top to the bottom of Division I. The overriding message: "We just want a legitimate chance to win one or two tournament games, NOT win a state championship."
- June 28, 2023: OHSAA staff members met with Board of Directors during NFHS Summer Meeting to begin discussions on expansion of OHSAA tournament divisions. Discussion has been on-going.
- December 13, 2023: OHSAA sent memo to school administrators to share that the association is studying tournament division expansion in seven sports.

OHSAA TOURNAMENT DIVISIONS: RECENT REVIEWS - 1

- Reviewed and Studied Other States (Number of Divisions; Uniqueness of Tournaments)
 - Many Midwest states are similar to Ohio
 - Illinois: Lower percent of teams in Division I; maximum of 4 divisions (football: 8)
 - Michigan: Very similar to Ohio
 - Indiana: Very similar to Ohio (FB all teams in; less regular season games), but individual sports have only one (1) division
 - MANY states have a lot more divisions than Ohio, specially those with smaller number of participants

 See next slide
 - Also studied uniqueness of many states
 - Indiana: has two-year "success" formula; has gone to unequal number in four-division tournaments
 - Florida: 9 football divisions (4 metro divisions, 4 suburban divisions and 1 rural division)
 - California: Open Division in some sports like basketball and volleyball (committee selects top 32 teams, regardless of division, and looks at head-to-head records, strength of schedule, state or regional rankings
 - Regulations do not permit teams to opt out; can come from any division
 - Other states like Arizona doing something similar
 - Many states limit the number of teams entered into their tournaments (similar to Ohio football)


