## STADIUM PASS & PASS GATE INFORMATION

OHSAA Field Hockey Tournament Regulations permit a total of 28 individuals admitted without charge that is to be made up of the 22 players, and all other coaches, managers, statistician, team physician(s), trainers and team personnel.

Admission through the pass gate at Thomas Worthington Stadium will be granted to these 28 individuals via a **commemorative Bag Tag**. These will be shipped to you prior to Thursday.

The pass gate is located at the Dow Nelson Sports Complex (fieldhouse), located just past the main entrance of the Stadium. Once you enter the parking lot off Dublin Granville Rd, the Stadium will be on your left. Continue north and you will see the Dow Nelson Sports Complex on your left.



***No one without the approved OHSAA bag tag will be admitted without a paid admission ticket.***

Each team will also be provided 8 complimentary admission tickets for the Superintendent, Principal, Athletic Director and Bus Driver. These will be distributed with an online code from HomeTown Ticketing. Should there be any questions regarding tickets, please contact the following individuals:

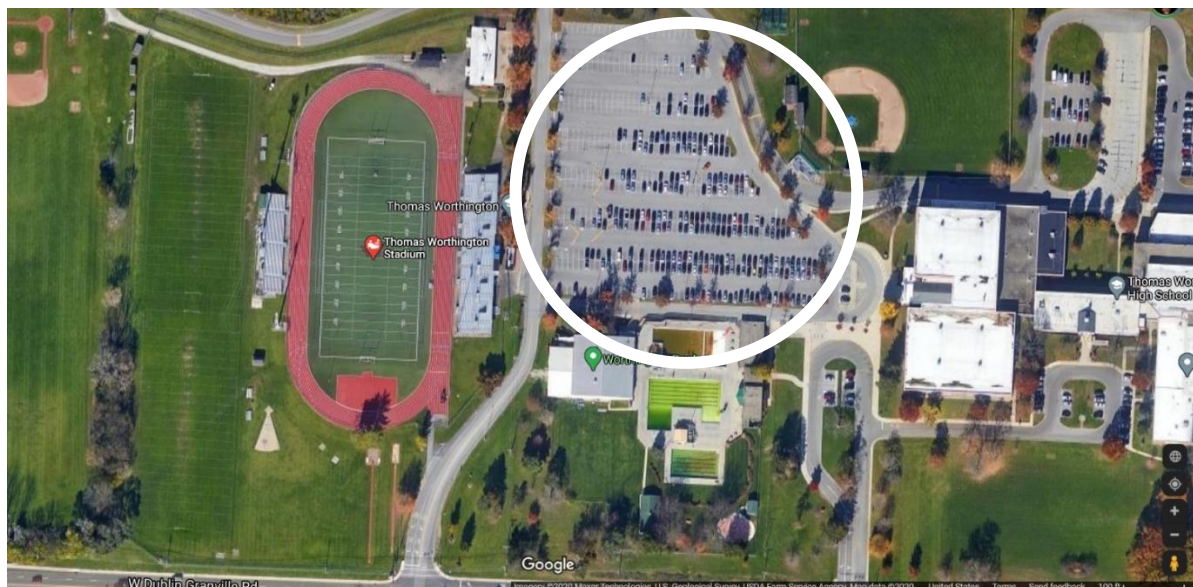
Tickets for the State Field Hockey Tournament are **\$12.00 per session**. Each semi-final on Thursday and the final on Saturday are all separate sessions. # PRE-GAME – FIELD REGULATIONS – TEAM INTRODUCTIONS

A 45-minute warm-up period shall be provided on the end of the field which that team will defend in the first quarter.

Twenty minutes prior to the game, the coach of each team shall submit the game roster with a maximum of 22 players who are designated as eligible to play. It is the responsibility of the coaches and the Tournament Manager to ensure that the number of players in uniform does not exceed 22 for each game. If either team is over the limit, it must be corrected at once. Failure to comply with the regulation at any time after notification by the Tournament Manager shall result in the forfeiture of the game.

Only players in uniform and other personnel, to a maximum of 28, shall be permitted on the team bench/sideline. The home bench will be on the east side of the stadium and the visiting bench will be on the west side of the stadium.

As soon as the warm-up time has concluded, the announcer will ask players to clear the field and return to the team benches. Players should immediately move to these areas and prepare for the introduction ceremony.

The announcer will make a brief welcoming statement and then will introduce the officials for the contest. During these remarks, players, coaches and other team personnel should face toward the east at or near their bench area. As soon as the officials have been introduced, the announcer will introduce the players for each team using an alternating procedure.

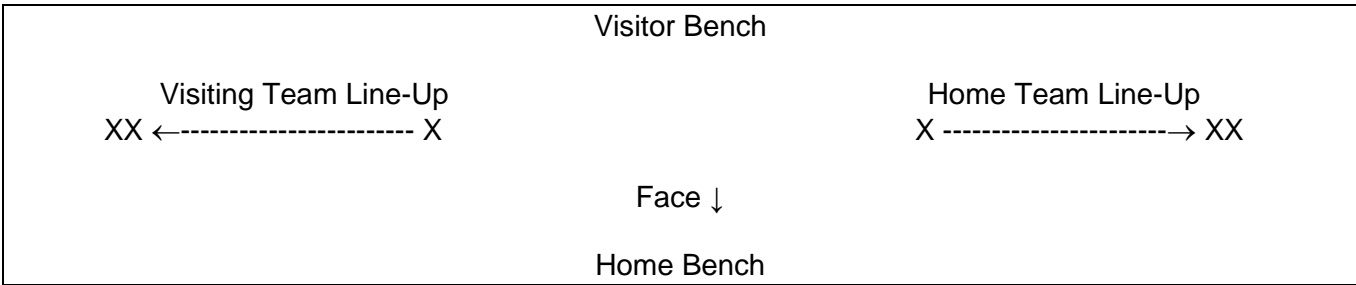
A player from the visiting team (team on the lower bracket) will be introduced first followed by a player from the home team, etc. The non-starters will be introduced first, then the starting 11 and finally the coaches.

As each person's name is called, please run out on the field near the center line and face that half of the field toward the goal your team will be attacking. Remain in that line until your opponent is introduced. At the end of each set of introductions, each player or coach should be facing an opponent. Please greet each other (with no physical contact) in the spirit of good sportsmanship and then move down the field in a line facing the east side spectators. Please turn and wave to the west side spectators. (See Diagram)

Please remain standing on the field for the National Anthem. At the completion of the anthem, please leave the field quickly and return to your benches. The starters should then return to the field, and the game will commence.

## BALL RETRIEVERS

Each school has received three (3) additional bag tag passes for “ball retrievers.” If a school does not plan to utilize all three ball retrievers, the extra passes are *not to be used for those in the bench area*. **Only 28 persons in the bench area will be permitted.**

## FIELD ACCESS – SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS

Each school will be provided two (2) Field Access Passes for Administrators. These will be provided at the pass gate at Thomas Worthington. If the school wishes to have any additional administrators on the field, these can be used for supervision of student/fans. All Field Passes issued will be strictly for supervision of school fans and participation in the Awards Ceremony.

Field passes are not a form of admission.

## SPORTING CONDUCT

We have high expectations for team personnel and spectators in the area of sporting conduct, with respect for oneself and others.

Please ensure that this message is reflected in all communications to the guests that will be traveling with you to Worthington for this State Tournament. We expect all team personnel and spectators to conduct themselves in a sporting fashion. **Please be advised that we will not tolerate fan misbehavior, public intoxication or other forms of inappropriate conduct that is inconsistent with the values of interscholastic athletics.** We have hired security to assist us where necessary and will not hesitate to involve school and athletic administrators where necessary. We really appreciate your communication with your fan base and students on these issues.

## OFFICIALS

The officials for the State Tournament have been selected based on ratings from coaches and school administrators. We expect all participants to treat all contest officials with respect. Protests arising from the decisions and interpretations of the rules by officials during the game will not be considered. Their decisions and interpretations are final. (OHSAA Bylaw 8-3-1).

***Disrespect toward officials in any form, whether on site or after a contest through social media or the press, shall not be tolerated.***



## VIDEO/FILM

The NFHS Network will be broadcasting all State Field Hockey Tournament games. A pay-per-view link will be posted on the OHSAA Field Hockey Tournament Coverage page closer to the start of the tournament. This is our first year working with the NFHS Network for our State Tournament(s), so we will follow back up on how DVD's may be purchased. Tom Linder and former Ohio State Buckeye, Doreena Beebe, will be the play-by-play announcers.

## COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Please review the OHSAA Field Hockey COVID-19 Guidelines ([HERE](#)) and the Responsible RestartOhio guidelines ([HERE](#)) prior to attending the State Tournament. Please share these documents with your spectators and communities that are attending as well. Making sure all individuals participating and attending are following these guidelines is essential, especially coming from different areas of the state.

Please be sure to wear masks when required, conduct symptom assessments, properly social distance at all times and all of the safety protocols you and your fans have been adhering to throughout the season. This applies to all participants and spectators. There shall be NO congregating of any kind before or after the game(s) by players, coaches, officials or spectators. Please keep this in mind, especially at the conclusion of each game. We ask that any gatherings take place back in your home communities.

## NOTES FROM THOMAS WORTHINGTON

There is no insurance covering property damage. If property is damaged at a tournament site by competing school teams, student body and/or spectators, the school itself shall be liable and pay the cost of repair or replacement. Other damages to facilities not attributed to a competing school could be a legitimate tournament expense and schools may be invoiced accordingly. If damage is extensive, the Board of Directors will become involved. Student crowd control at State Tournaments is the responsibility of the school administrators of the competing schools.

All patrons should be advised not to leave articles of value in their automobiles. The Association will not be responsible for loss of property.

A licensed athletic trainer will be on duty at all times.

## TIE-BREAK PROCEDURES

In the event that the regulation game ends in a tie, we will use the approved OHSAA tie break procedure.

The officials will review this process with you prior to each tie break period.

### Overtime: National Federation Field Hockey Rule 6-1-4

The following complete overtime procedures shall be followed in **OHSAA tournament competition only**. These procedures have been approved by the Board of Directors and are NOT OPTIONAL. **These procedures shall be used to break all ties in OHSAA tournament play** and should be thoroughly reviewed by all tournament officials and varsity coaches prior to all contests played in the OHSAA tournament.

During all overtime play-

- A. All game rules apply except as specified below.
- B. Unlimited substitution shall be permitted.
- C. There shall be a five-minute intermission between the end of the regular game and the start of the overtime period. At this time, the contest officials shall insure that the tie-break procedures are available at the scorer's table and shall review them thoroughly prior to the initiation of the overtime.
- D. There shall be a two-minute intermission between each subsequent overtime period. (Not applicable for regular season tie-break procedures). During these intermissions, players may confer with their coaches, and substitutions may be made.
- E. Prior to each overtime procedure, officials shall review with the head coaches the procedures for that session. This shall take place prior to the initiation of each overtime procedure until the game is decided.
- G. Prior to beginning overtime, during the intermission between the end of the regular game and the start of overtime, the officials shall meet with the team captains for a coin toss, the visiting team captain calling the coin in the air. Winner shall have choice of possession.

### **REDUCED PLAYER 10SV-10SV - PS – SVPS**

1. Play a **10-minute "Sudden Victory" (SV)** overtime period, with teams not changing goals at the end of the regular game. **Teams shall play with 6 field players and a goalkeeper. THE FIRST TEAM TO SCORE A GOAL SHALL BE THE WINNER.**
2. If a tie still exists, there shall be a **second 10-minute "Sudden Victory" (SV)** overtime period utilizing the reduced player procedure described in "1" above. Teams shall change goals to begin the second overtime period following the two-minute intermission. Players may confer with their coaches and substitutions may be made. **THE FIRST TEAM TO SCORE A GOAL SHALL BE THE WINNER.**  
The team not having possession of the ball to start the first overtime period shall have possession to start the second overtime period.
3. If a tie still exists after the second 10-minute "Sudden Victory" overtime period, **one series of penalty strokes shall be taken** alternating the attackers and goalkeepers at the same goal chosen by the officials. Five different stokers from each team shall be selected **from any eligible player on the team roster**. NOTE: A player taking a penalty stroke within a series of five strokes may not repeat within that set of strokes.  
Only the coaches and remaining team members may be on the field and behind the 25-yard line. Prior to the first PS set, the officials shall meet with the team captains for a coin toss. The winner of the coin toss which shall be called by the visiting team captain may choose to stroke or defend the goal first. Penalty strokes shall be terminated and a game winner declared as soon as one team has more goals than the opponent does after the set of five strokes for each side has been taken or the difference is unable to be overcome by completing the series. **Officials should insure that there are no spectators behind the end line behind the goal where the strokes are being taken. NOTE: This first set of Penalty Strokes is NOT a SUDDEN VICTORY SET.**
4. If a tie still exists after the first set of penalty strokes, there shall be **Sudden Victory (SVPS) penalty strokes** taken. The team not stroking first in the first set shall start the **Sudden Victory Penalty Stroke** procedure. **The stokers and/or order of the stokers may be changed for the Sudden Victory Penalty Stroke procedure.** Penalty strokes shall be terminated as soon as one team has more goals than the opponent does after an equal number of strokes have been taken up to a maximum of five for each team. If a tie still exists, after a total of five strokes for each team, another **Sudden Victory Penalty Stroke** procedure shall be commenced.

5. This **Sudden Victory Penalty Stroke procedure** shall continue until the tie is broken. The stokers and/or order of the stokers may be changed. The order of teams stroking or defending first shall alternate from the previous SVPS procedure.
6. Please note: On all penalty corners during the reduced play overtime, a maximum of four defenders shall be back completely behind the end line. This number includes the goalkeeper. The other three defenders shall be beyond the centerline.
7. If a player is disqualified during the regulation game, the team shall play short into the overtime procedure. The player is not eligible for return to the contest.

If a player is suspended during the regulation game (yellow card), the suspension carries over into the overtime period until served completely, and the team shall play short. If the suspension occurs in the overtime period immediately preceding the Penalty Stroke procedure and the player is unable to serve the complete time of the suspension, she is no longer eligible to participate in the remainder of the overtime procedure.

# CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS CEREMONY

**Please be aware that the awards ceremony may be altered up until the Championship game on Saturday due to COVID-19. We appreciate your patience in us navigating the safest way to award our State Champion and State Runner-Up at all of our fall sport State Tournaments, while making sure we are able to congratulate the efforts of playing the State Tournament.**

The presentation of trophies and awards is the culmination of a great season by both teams.

Emotions run high at each level of the tournament. The high school players have earned their way to this important final game and deserve the recognition they are to receive from their fans. In the name of high school athletics, we ask head coaches, assistant coaches *and* administrators to assist with players maintaining and exhibiting good sportsmanship before, during and after the awards presentation. A few important aspects of this that are expected:

- Each player and coach is expected to have the medal placed around their neck
- Each player and coach should KEEP the medal around their neck and maintain this during the presentation
- Each player and coach should remain on the baseline during the awards presentation to the opposing team

No doubt, there will be a short ‘wave of celebrating’ when the game ends. After the first wave of celebrating has subsided, please have your athletes form a line approximately 15 yards from the sideline in front of your bench facing the crowd.

## **Runner-Up Team**

The runner-up awards will be presented first. As the name of each player and manager is called, they will step forward and the coach from the school will place the medal around his/her neck. After receiving the award, the athlete will return to the line with the remainder of the team.

The coach will be called last. While the coach is at the table, the captain, co-captains or seniors (or individuals designated by the coach will be asked to come forward for the team trophy presentation, made by an OHSAA Director. Please remain in position until all awards have been made to the championship team as well.

## **Championship Team**

The championship awards will be presented next. As the name of each player and manager is called, they will step forward and the coach from the school will place the medal around his/her neck. After receiving the award, the athlete will return to the line with the remainder of the team.

The coach will be called last. While the coach is at the table, the captain, co-captains or seniors (or individuals designated by the coach will be asked to come forward for the team trophy presentation, made by an OHSAA Director. Please remain in position until all awards have been made to the championship team as well.

After the awards ceremony, we ask that any gatherings with family and fans take place back in your home communities. We expect you to relay this message to your fans. Please respect this decision, as we are looking to avoid any type of gathering—this includes inside the facility and on the grounds of Thomas Worthington High School, including the parking lots.

Tournament Regulations limit the number of awards to be presented at each level of play. Since many include more than the number of awards permitted on their Team Rosters, **please review this carefully** prior to the Championship game so there is no confusion to anyone that does not receive awards. There are others that you may wish to order medals for (other assistant coaches, managers, trainers). Additional medals may be ordered through Croton Craft Awards, **1-800-947-5521**.

## AFTER THE TOURNAMENT

After the Tournament is complete, Athletic Administrators/Coaches generally want to know how to obtain certain items. Here is a basic overview of how to receive the items:
