Welcome to the Playoffs!

Football practice officially started back on August 1 across Ohio and 710 schools ended the season playing 11-man football. Now, 224 schools have qualified for the 2019 OHSAA football playoffs.

Coldwater (Div. VI) has qualified for the playoffs for the 23rd-consecutive season, which is a new state record. Meanwhile, five schools are in the playoffs for the first time in their school's history, including Xenia (Div. II), Delaware Olentangy Berlin (Div. II, opened in 2018), Columbus Centennial (Div. III), Worthington Christian (Div. VI) and Cincinnati College Prep Academy (Div. VII).

And for the first time since 2001, an undefeated record wasn't enough to qualify for the playoffs. It happened to both Northwood (Div. V, Region 18) and Gibsonburg (Div. VI, Region 23), as both went 10-0. Previously, Newcomerstown in 2001 was the last school that went undefeated but didn't make the playoffs.

Playoffs Format and State Finals Schedule

During the first four rounds of the playoffs, Division I, II, III and VI games are on Fridays. Division IV, V and VII playoff games are on Saturdays. All games will kick off at 7 p.m.

The state championship games (fifth round of the playoffs) remain in Canton this year at Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium. One division will be selected to play its state championship game on Thursday, Dec. 5 (7 p.m. kickoff). There will be three state championship games on Friday, Dec. 6, followed by three championship games on Saturday, Dec. 7. Game times on Friday and Saturday are 10 a.m., 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. The divisional assignments will be announced after the state semifinal games.

Brackets and Pairings

During the playoffs, the brackets at OHSAA.org will be updated on Friday and Saturday nights. The pairings and neutral sites for the second, third and fourth rounds will be posted on Sundays by 3:30 p.m., after all sites have been confirmed.

Ticket Information

Fans are encouraged to buy their playoff tickets in advance at the participating schools, which keep a percentage of the revenue. For regional playoff games, tickets are \$8 presale and \$9 at the gate. All-session ticket books for the state championship games are on sale. The top tier ticket option includes indoor access in the stadium club during and between games. A premium parking pass is also available for sale. Access to the Pro Football Hall of Fame is included with some ticket packages.

In the Beginning... to Seven Divisions

When the OHSAA created the football playoffs in 1972, there were

three divisions (called Class A, AA and AAA) and only one playoff qualifier per region (12 total playoff qualifiers). Now in its 47th year, the postseason now has seven divisions and 224 total playoff qualifiers. Expansion occurred in 1980 to five divisions and two qualifiers per region, and then again in 1985 to four qualifiers per region. In 1994, a sixth division was added, while in 1999, the number of qualifiers per region increased to eight. The playoffs expanded to seven divisions in 2013.

Credentials for Playoff Games

For the first four rounds of the playoffs, media must contact the host site's media coordinator by 3 p.m. on Tuesday. Contact information for the media coordinator for each game will be posted within the brackets at OHSAA.org. Media coordinators will work with the athletic director at the schools and follow the OHSAA's press box priority seating scale.

Playoff Games On TV

Spectrum will make its playoff game selections by noon on Mondays. Spectrum has exclusivity of the games it selects. Other games are available for tape-delay telecasts, which can be shown beginning at 11 PM the same day of the game.

OHSAA Radio Network Programming

On Wednesdays during the playoffs, the OHSAA Radio Network will distribute a 30 minute preview show. The network will also broadcast all seven state championship games. Affiliates have their rights fees waived throughout the playoffs.

higher seed will host the playoff game at its home stadium or the stadium of its choosing. The No. 8 seed will play at the No. 1 seed, the No. 7 seed at No. 2, etc.

Regional Semifinals (Nov. 15 and 16), Regional Finals (Nov. 22 and 23) and State Semifinals (Nov. 29 and 30): Neutral sites are selected by the OHSAA. There are many factors that go into determining playoff sites, such as quality of field surface, seating capacity, quality of lighting, size of locker rooms and distance from field, press box size, parking spaces available, and a separate locker room for officials. After all those factors are taken into consideration, it must be confirmed that the site is available and willing to host a playoff game on the date needed.

Making History

Entering the 2019 season, 58 OHSAA member schools had never made the football playoffs. That number has now decreased by five, as Xenia (Div. II), Delaware Olentangy Berlin (Div. II, opened in 2018), Columbus Centennial (Div. III), Worthington Christian (Div. VI) and Cincinnati College Prep Academy (Div. VII) qualified this year for the first time.

In 2018, two schools (Toledo Start in Div. I and Springfield Northwestern in Division IV) qualified for the playoffs for the first time. The number of first-time playoff participants since 2000 includes four in 2019, two in 2018, four in 2017, eight in 2016, eight in 2015, 10 in 2014, two in 2013, seven in 2012, eight in 2011, six in 2010, 14 in 2009, 12 in 2008, 14 in 2007, 10 in 2006, 12 in 2005, 16 in 2004, 12 in 2003, 21 in 2002, 17 in 2001 and 26 in 2000.

Noting the Undefeated and .500

Only 28 teams in Ohio went undefeated this season. Of note, two undefeated schools, Gibsonburg and Northwood, did not qualify for the playoffs. Of the 26 undefeated schools that did qualify, all of them except two will host a first-round playoff game this weekend. There is one first-round game that pits two undefeated teams. That occurs in Div. VI, Region 21, when Salineville Southern Local (10-0) travels to Glouster Trimble (10-0).

In 2018, of the 24 teams that went undefeated during the regular-season, 20 of them won their first-round playoff games, including three on the road (Garfield Heights in Div. II, McDonald in Div. VI and Pandora-Gilboa in Div. VII). In the playoff era (since 1972), the fewest number of undefeated teams was 2015 when only 22 teams went undefeated.

Six teams with 5-5 records qualified for the playoffs this year. Last year a state record 11 schools with 5-5 records qualified for the playoffs. Only one of those 5-5 teams - Warren John F. Kennedy in Division VII - won their regional quarterfinal game. JFK reached the regional finals.

Speaking of Making History...

While the aforementioned four schools are in the playoffs for the first time, Newark Catholic (Div. VII) is in the playoffs for the 36th time, which allows the Green Wave to reclaim the top spot in OHSAA history.

Welcome Back

Several schools are back in the playoffs after a long hiatus. Leading the pack is Cleveland Heights Lutheran East (Div. V) and Reedsville Eastern (Div. VII), which both qualified for the first time since 2001. Others include New Bremen (Div. VII, 2004), Union City Mississinawa Valley (Div. VII, 2004), Howard East Knox (Div. VI, 2005), Harrod Allen East (Div. VI, 2006), Dola Hardin Northern (Div. VII, 2006), Wellston (Div. V, 2006), Cincinnati Princeton (Div. I, 2007) and Groveport Madison (Div. I, 2007).

In 2018, in Division VII, playoff returners included Ashtabula St. John (1987), Franklin Furnace Green (1990), Hamilton Little Miami (1992) and Youngstown East (1997).

In 2017, Milford (Div. I) was back in the playoffs for the first time since 1986, while Sidney (Div. II) was back for the first time since 1989. Two teams in Div. IV were also back after a long hiatus, including Pepper Pike Orange (1988) and London (1989). In 2015, Burton Berkshire was back in the playoffs for the first time since 1981. In 2013, Norwalk was back in the playoffs for the first time since winning the state championship in 1974.

Coldwater Sets Playoff Streak

Coldwater has qualified for the playoffs for the 23rd-consecutive season, which sets a new state record held previously by Cleveland St. Ignatius from 1988 through 2009. Coldwater recently went to the state championship game eight straight years (2009-16) to tie Newark Catholic (1980-87) for the state record of consecutive title game appearances. Cleveland St. Ignatius won the state championship six years in a row (1991-96).

Consecutive Playoff Wins Record

Coldwater (streak ended in 2016) and Maria Stein Marion Local (streak ended in 2015) recently set the OHSAA record for most consecutive playoff victories with 24. Akron Archbishop Hoban has won four-straight state championships, resulting in an active 20-game postseason winning streak.

First-Round Playoff Results by Seed

In 2018, higher seeds (home teams) went 82-30 in the first round of the playoffs. No. 1 seeds went 26-2, No. 2 seeds went 20-8, No. 3 seeds went 21-7 and No. 4 seeds went 15-13. The two No. 8 seeds to win at No. 1 seeds included Rocky River in Division III (defeated Clyde 27-17) and Leipsic in Division VII (defeated Sycamore Mohawk 40-14).

In 2017 playoffs, the higher seeds went 83-29 in the first round and there was one No. 8 seed that won, as Reading defeated Casstown Miami East 27-25 in Div. V. In 2016, first-round hosts went 80-32 and five No. 8 seeds won, including Avon Lake in Div. II (27-26 at Avon), Akron East in Div. III (50-37 at Marlington), Philo in Div. VI (42-7 at Heath), Garrettsville Garfield in Div. V (31-21 at Canfield South Range) and Columbus Bishop Ready in Div. VI (28-21 at Hannibal River). In 2015, first-round hosts went 81-31 and four No. 1 seeds lost.

Building on History

Week 10 Movers

Many schools needed to win their final regular-season game last weekend in order to clinch a playoff berth. Several schools had big wins to jump into the playoff field after being outside the Top 8 in their region heading into week 10.

A total of 20 schools were outside the Top 8 in their region heading into week 10, but qualified for the playoffs. The biggest mover was Milan Edison (Div. IV, Region 14), which went from 12th to fifth.

First Round Success

Three schools continued their amazing success rate in the first round of the playoffs last season. St. Henry has been in the playoffs 17 times and is 17-0 in first-round playoff games. Cincinnati Colerain is 20-0 in the first round, although one of its first-round games (1995) was later forfeited. Since 1998, Coldwater is 21-0 in the first-round of the playoffs (22-2 all-time in the first round). In addition, three schools won their first-round playoff game nine straight years before losing, including Germantown Valley View, Mogadore and Newark Licking Valley.

Championship Games Return to Canton

After hosting the OHSAA state championship games in Columbus throughout the 1980s, natural grass was installed in Ohio Stadium in Columbus in the spring of 1990 and OSU asked the OHSAA to move its football state championship games to another location. The OHSAA found a home in Stark County, with Canton Fawcett Stadium and Massillon Paul Brown Tiger Stadium sharing the state championship games for 24 years from 1990-2013. The finals returned to Columbus from 2014-16 before returning to Canton for 2017 and 2018.

Proving the Pollsters

All 70 teams that were ranked in the Week 9 Associated Press state poll have qualified for the playoffs. The final AP poll will be released Monday, Nov. 4.

During the playoffs, this weekly release will contain a breakdown of how the state's top-ranked teams according to the AP poll have fared in the postseason.
