Questions of the Week

Here are a couple of questions I received this week:

- 1. Can a school play 2 games per week? Yes. Regulations limit players to 4 quarters in a day and 50 quarters (9-12) per season.

Ejections

Remember there are 2 types of ejections that the length of suspension may be reduced with video:

- 1. Ejections for fighting.
- 2. Ejections for flagrant personal fouls (hits like blindside blocks and targeting to name a few)

Tinted Visors

NFHS Rule 1-5-3c4 states that visors must be clear and that tinted eyewear (glasses) may be worn under the clear visor. **A prescription from a Dr. does not supersede this rule.** Any accommodation outside of NFHS Rules (NFHS Rule 1, Section 7) for an athlete in football must be approved by the OHSAA office (Beau Rugg). The accommodation is only granted if the rule does not resolve the player's condition. Have your Athletic Director contact me. **Please inform your middle schools of this policy.**
