Questions of the Week

Here are a couple of questions I received this week:

- 1. For some reason I have had several questions about offensive linemen's numbers. Remember, on normal scrimmage plays, the offense is required to have 5 players on the line wearing numbers 50-79. Also, a player is eligible to catch a legal forward pass by number AND position.
- 2. Lots of questions on drones (Unmanned Aircraft Systems). These are up to the host school in regular season but check with the FAA. We do not currently allow them for tournament games. We are reviewing that policy. Our regulations are on page 85 of the following link Handbook.pdf (ohsaaweb.blob.core.windows.net)

Rules

- 1. Visors: NFHS Rule 1-5-3c4 states that visors must be clear and that tinted eyewear (glasses) may be worn under the clear visor. A prescription from a Dr. does not supersede this rule. Any accommodation outside of NFHS Rules (NFHS Rule 1, Section 8) for an athlete in football must be approved by the OHSAA office (Beau Rugg). The accommodation is only granted if the rule does not resolve the player's condition. Have your Athletic Director contact me.
- 2. Mouthpieces: Players are cutting their mouthpiece off of the helmet attachment and leaving the attachment piece on the helmet. This is illegal equipment.
