Coaches Packet Pick Up

Coaches packets may be picked up in Auxiliary gym beginning Friday March 3rd at 2:00PM and on Saturday March 4th at 10:00AM.

Mandatory Coaches Meeting

There will be a mandatory coaches meeting on **Friday March 3rd 3:00PM ET** and **Saturday March 4th at 11:00AM ET** in the warm up area of the auxiliary gym.

Additions, scratches and withdrawals

A competitor may be added (provided the limit of six per event is not exceeded), withdrawn or substituted with another eligible gymnast at the coaches meeting before competition.

Competitors on a team do not have to be the same individuals who competed in the prior Tournament.

A coach may replace an eligible gymnast for a competitor who is injured or becomes ill during warm-ups or competition. The substitute gymnast will receive warm-up time equal to that of other gymnasts on the event,

or events, at the directive of the tournament manager. The injured/ill gymnast thus replaced may be permitted to reenter the competition for any other event for which she was entered, provided she is authorized to do so by coaching staff/medical personnel.

A coach may choose to “scratch” an injured gymnast from an event in which she is entered rather than replace her. The gymnast will receive a “score of zero” by presenting herself for the event in her rotation and touching the apparatus.

Alternates

An alternate gymnast may compete in the individual competition of the State Tournament if a qualifying gymnast cannot compete due to illness, injury, flagrant misconduct or ineligibility. The alternate shall be the next highest individual qualifier in that event from that District Tournament. Replacement of these athletes or the team may be made at anytime during the competition. Tournament staff will determine the group placement. The athlete and her coach or the next qualified team must report to the OHSAA Sport Administrator for verification. If the replacement can be made prior to Tuesday of the week of the state tournament by 4:00 PM, the name of the competitor(s) shall be placed into the official program.

School Representatives

The head coach officially designated on the school’s emergency contact form for gymnastics is the school representative. If another is to serve as school representative, this must be submitted in writing to OHSAA Sport Administrator, Kate Barnett (kbarnett@ohsaa.org) **Note:** All coaches must have a valid Pupil Activity/Coaching Permit and number.

NFHS Network

The Tournament will be not be streamed on the NFHS network.

First Aid and Licensed Athletic Trainer Services

Two licensed athletic trainers will be available to any participant during all warm-ups and competition times.

Preliminary and Final Results

Electronic scoring will be provided throughout the meet. Display boards will flash individual scores after each event.

Awards Ceremony

An awards ceremony will take place at the conclusion of the event. Those receiving awards are asked to remain dressed in competition warm up or leotard and remain on the podium for the ceremony. Gymnasts in street clothes will not be permitted to participate in the awards ceremony.

Ticket Information

The OHSAA State Gymnastics Tournament tickets will be conducted online through HomeTown Ticketing. No physical passes shall be accepted.

Coach Credentials: Coach credentials will be providing based on the following number of qualifiers:

1-4 competitors: 1 coach pass
5 or more competitors: 2 coach passes

Administrator Tickets/Credentials: Each school with competitors shall receive three (3) complimentary administrative tickets for access to the State Gymnastics Tournament. Upon arrival, administrators may request an all-access credential to be on the floor with the teams.

Additional Gymnasts/Coaches: Coaches may bring additional team members beyond the the number of qualified individuals but must pay the student price for each additional individual. Coaches may purchase the electronic ticket online prior to arrival or online at the event. There is no limit to the number of additional team members coaches may bring and purchase tickets for. Additional coaches planning to attend, must purchase a ticket.

Facility and Entry Information

Friday March 3rd: Doors will open for competitors at 2:00PM ET. Please enter through the team entrance indicated on the map below at B10. Teams will be asked to stay in the gymnasium and locker room areas until school has been dismissed for the day. Spectators will not be permitted in the building until this 3:00PM ET to allow for the dismissal of school.

Saturday March 4th: Doors will open for competitors at 10:00AM ET. Please enter through the team entrance indicated on the map below at B10. Doors will open to the public at 10:30 AM ET.

Parking: Hilliard Bradley will be charging \$5.00 for parking both Friday and Saturday.
